Evelyn Edna Bales was born in the farming community of Fannystelle, MB, on September 19, 1920. She was the youngest of nine children and the only sibling who was a Canadian. Her family moved from Fannystelle to Monominto, then to Anola, east of Transcona.

Evelyn married Murray Stone Smith in 1937. He started his career at CN as a "call boy" and later became a switchman. They made their home in a war-time house in Transcona where Evelyn gave birth to two daughters. Illness forced her husband to retire in the 1970s after some 30-odd years with CN. Evelyn became a widow in 1984.

She was a homemaker for many years while the girls were growing up, later working outside her home at Woolco, Perth's, Pasta's Grocery Store, and the Transcona News. In the 1970s and 1980s, Evelyn went to Ceramic School where she made many beautiful lasting pieces and she also started taking piano lessons. Both hobbies lasted several years. She loved to read and watch her favourite TV programs and only gave up these pleasures in her 90s. Evelyn was relatively healthy all her life, overcoming breast cancer at age 81, and undergoing a complicated hernia operation at age 89.



Evelyn currently resides in the Luther Home in Winnipeg where she receives quality care. She moved out of her wartime house in 2019. At the Home, she participates in many of their activities, gets her hair done, attends church services, goes to therapy, and loves her meals. She is always happy to see family members whenever they can visit.



Pension Report - Linda Schram

Pension Committee Representative

Pension increases will be a minimum of \$9.00 per month for eligible retirees and \$4.50 for surviving spouses. Maximum monthly increase is \$35.14. This will be effective in January 2021.

To be eligible for indexation, you must have been retired on or before December 31, 2016. Spouses of deceased retirees qualify if the deceased retiree would have met the above eligibility requirements.

In a meeting in November we received a report from the CN Investment Division that the fund is doing well and has exceeded their expectations.



Health Care Report - Linda Schram

Health Care Representative

I am pleased to report that there will be no increase in Blue Cross premiums for 2021. British Columbia and the Atlantic provinces were not so lucky and will have increases of 9% each.

One way of keeping costs down is to use a pharmacy that has lower prescription fees. Sobeys, Rexall and Shoppers have higher prescription fees than Walmart and the lowest being Costco.

The mail order pharmacy Alliance Central has been vetted by Blue Cross and has very competitive fees. It is for ongoing prescriptions. You can call them with your questions 1-833-815-5756. They are located in Winnipeg. You may be able to save yourself and the plan some money.

As the year comes to an end it's time to gather all your medical receipts that you haven't been reimbursed for and send them into Blue Cross. If you submit them online you will receive the funds within days.



We have been talking about a National Pharmacare Program. It seems like forever and while I assume it is still years away, it is finally making it to Parliament. A good first step at least.

A poll done by Angus Reid Institute shows that nearly 9 in 10 Canadians want a National Pharmacare plan and many of those are seniors. Seniors over 70 use 72% of all prescriptions.

In February 2020, Burnaby MP Peter Julian introduced Bill C-213 – the <u>Canada Pharmacare Act</u>, a historic step in the history of our country. The legislation will start the first hour of debate this month. The second hour of debate and the first Parliamentary vote will be in February 2021. Bill C-213 could be the law next year if all goes well.

We will be writing the federal government and actively lobbying on behalf of our CN Pensioners.

CN Community Board – Funding Grassroots Community Groups

CN now has a program designed to donate funds to grassroots community organizations in Winnipeg and across Manitoba.

Last year, during the CN 100 Celebrations in Winnipeg, CN announced the formation of the CN Winnipeg Community Board. Its mandate is to support local, grassroots organizations with smaller grant funding requests of up to \$20,000. It's part of CN's commitment to help build safer, stronger communities.

The Community Board's focus is on four main areas:

- Health and Safety of all members of the community
- Civic Engagement to bring people together and promote quality of life
- Environmental Sustainability to protect the environment and enhance green spaces
- **Innovation** to support innovation through transportation education and research

To be eligible, applicants must be non-profit registered charities, and must submit applications through CN's Grantstream on-line website.

Over the last year, the CN Winnipeg Community Board has provided financial support to nearly twenty local organization. Recipients include food banks, women's, family and youth resource centres and programs, community health centres, and others. As so many Manitobans struggle to cope with Covid pandemic-related challenges. The Community Board is paying special attention to organizations and programs that are helping people meet immediate needs: food, shelter, physical and mental health.

The CN Winnipeg Community Board is chaired by David Angus, former president and CEO of the Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce and now president of the Johnston Group. Its members include other prominent Winnipeg business and community leaders, as well as local CN senior leaders Paul Hackett (General Manager Network Operations) and David Radford (Sr. Director, CN Campus Winnipeg). Jim Feeny represents local CN pensioners, and local CN Public Affairs Manager Jasdeep Devgan is the Board secretary.

Staying in Touch - - - Now, and even more especially over the holiday season, it's important to stay in touch with friends and loved ones. If you have time, pick up the phone and call someone just to see how they are doing.

What you need to make a video call

Do you have a computer, tablet or smartphone? Want to learn how to make a video call.

Whatever device you're using, you're going to need it to have a camera. Using your smartphone for video calling is a great option. Mobiles are lightweight, easy to move from one room to another, and often have front-facing and rear-facing cameras that you can swap between. Most modern tablets will also have a built-in camera.

If you're using a computer, you'll need to activate the built-in webcam or purchase a plug-in webcam if that's not an option. These plug into a USB port and sometimes ship with additional third-party software to help you tweak the picture settings. There are countless video calling apps available, but we've picked out four of the most popular: Apple FaceTime, Facebook Messenger, Skype and WhatsApp. All four services work on smartphones (FaceTime only works on Apple devices, though). If you want to use your computer to video call, your best bets are Skype or Facebook Messenger. All of these are free to download and use over wi-fi. But note that if you're using them over a 3G, 4G or 5G connection, you'll eat into your mobile data allowance. Crucially, if you're using an app to video call, the person you're trying to contact will need the same app. For help, just Google how to make a video call on your computer or smartphone.

Railroaders In The Community CN Introduces Exciting New Program



How the CN Railroaders in the Community Works:



CN is proud of the hundreds of employees, their families, and pensioners who give generously of their time to local causes through our CN Railroaders in the Community program. They are part of the fabric of the many cities, towns and villages across our entire North American network, helping to make their communities better places to live and work

CN supports their efforts by providing charitable donations to the organizations where CN railroaders volunteer.

Each hour of volunteer work earns a \$15 reward, up to a maximum of \$3,240 per employee per year (including volunteer hours completed by family members) and \$2,250 per pensioner per year (including volunteer hours completed by their spouse/surviving spouse). There is a maximum of 150 hours per calendar year for which you can claim rewards.

Incentive Bonus: if you are a current member of the CNPA (paying your \$1 per month membership), CN will give an additional reward of \$100 to one of the charities you volunteered for. This is another great reason to become a member of the CNPA, and to enter your 2020 volunteer hours into the new platform before Dec. 31.

How the Incentive Bonus Works: At the end of each calendar year, the CNPA will send a list to CN of all Pensioners who have paid their membership fee. CN will cross-reference this list with the Pensioners who applied for volunteer awards in RRITC in that calendar year. Through the Spark website, CN will send \$100 to a single charity that each member volunteered for. If a member volunteered for more than one charity, CN will contact the Pensioner in early January to ask them which charity should receive the bonus \$100. The bonus payments will be entered in January with the funds being transferred by mid-February. Please note that there is one (1) \$100 bonus per PIN and applies equally to surviving spouses.

As the RRITC program ends December 31st and restarts January 1st annually, all awards are reset. Therefore, any volunteer hours for the current year should be entered into Spark in that year in order for the bonus to be paid out in January/February. In order to qualify for the bonus \$100 for your charity, the minimum volunteer time is just one hour.

There is no limit to the number of organizations an employee, their family members, CN pensioners and the spouses/surviving spouses of CN pensioners can volunteer with.

Thanks to our new digital platform, you can now easily track your volunteer hours and see when the donation to your charity was made.

Normal volunteer rewards are transferred electronically to the eligible organizations on a monthly basis.
