

Tribute to President Ron Davis

Ron Davis 1933 - 2023

Ron Davis passed away Wednesday, November 8th, at Riverview Health Centre - Palliative Care, in Winnipeg, after a long illness.

In 1995 Ron and four others started the CN Pensioners Association of Manitoba as we know it today.

Ron served as Secretary from 1995 to 2004, as Health Care Representative from 2005 to 2015, and as President from 2009 to 2023. Ron also served as President of the National Council in 2006 and was appointed Special Advisor to the National Council because of his experience and knowledge, a position he held for several years.

That represents a remarkable total of 28 years of volunteer service in our Association.

Health Care Report - Joanne Gaborieau

Health Care Representative

We are pleased to report that there will be no increase to the MANITOBA Medavie Blue Cross Premiums in 2024.

REMINDER: All 2023 Medavie Blue Cross claims should be submitted as soon as possible. The deadline for reimbursement is April 30, 2024.

PLAN PROVISION CHANGES – While our ability to improve the Plan is limited when we are in a deficit situation, we continue to make cost effective improvements whenever possible. In 2024, there will be an increase to the amount you can claim for **annual eye examinations** and also for **foot orthoses** and **ambulances**. We also adjusted the amount you can claim for **Registered Nurses** in your home and have added **Acupuncturists and Occupational Therapists** as eligible specialists.



On Sunday December 10th., 2023 in St. Anne MB surrounded by a room full of family and friends, **Louise Anna Bedard** celebrated her 100th birthday! In honour of this milestone event, a yellow rose, her favourite flower, was given to each guest in attendance. In all, there were 100 yellow roses.





Louise enjoyed a very successful career as a Realtor. In fact, she was the first licensed female realtor in Manitoba and received several awards throughout her career.

Pension Report - Joanne Gaborieau

Pension Committee Representative

Pension increases will be a minimum of \$9.00 per month for eligible retirees and \$4.50 for surviving spouses. Maximum monthly increase is \$97.50. This will be effective in January 2024.

To be eligible for indexation, you must have been retired on or before December 31, 2019. Spouses of deceased retirees qualify if the deceased retiree would have met the above eligibility requirements.

T-4'S FROM CN - CN mails the Income Tax T-4 about the END of February. Please don't call CN Pension and Benefits Administration before the end of March. If you want it earlier, log into your account on the CN Pension & Benefits WEB Portal at cnbenefits.hroffice.com You can also view/print your monthly pension statements and your tax statements. You can change your address and even change your banking information.

Information on Travel Passes

For new marriages post retirement, the spouse is not entitled to pension survivor benefits under our pension plan. However, if the CN pensioner is eligible for a Travel Pass and then marries or remarries post retirement, the post-retirement spouse is eligible for the Travel Card (train pass).

You can simply call our CN Pensions call centre at 1-800-361-0739, and request one. The Customer Service Rep will take the required information and forward it to CN for processing.

Pensioner Audit Declaration

Each year, a number of CN pension recipients (retirees and surviving spouses) receive a letter asking them to validate their pension entitlement. If you receive this letter, it is important that you complete the form and promptly return it as instructed on the form.

These pension payment verifications are conducted annually to ensure that CN pension benefits are paid to eligible pension recipients and to protect the Plan from fraud.

Not responding to this required audit could ultimately result in the suspension of pension payments. Any change in address or phone number or death of a pension recipient or spouse should be reported to *CN Pension and Benefits Administration*.

Changes to Johnson Insurance programs

Johnson Insurance has offered discounted rates on both Travel as well as Home/Auto insurance to our members.

Home and Auto Insurance

In 2022, Johnson was acquired by Intact Insurance and in 2023, they migrated their Home/Auto Insurance over to Belairdirect, which is another insurance company under the Intact umbrella. In **Manitoba and Saskatchewan** specifically, Belairdirect does not offer Home/Auto insurance coverage, so starting in 2024, that coverage will be provided by Brokerlink, also an Intact company. Brokerlink does not, however, offer a discount program on their policies. Johnson will continue to service their insured customers until the policy expiration date. About 60 days prior to that expiration date, Brokerlink will contact the policy holder with their renewal documents package.

Travel Insurance

Johnson will continue to offer Travel Insurance under their brand name.



National Council Report - Bruce Anderson

Director, National Council

Report from the 2023 Annual Directors' Meeting (ADM) Montreal, Nov 23 – 24, 2023

Our meeting, held at the CN HQ building in Montreal, was the first in-person meeting since 2019. Attending from our Manitoba Council were Bruce Anderson, Joanne Gaborieau and Patrick McMullin. It was conducted as a hybrid meeting, so those unable or uncomfortable with travel, could attend virtually through Zoom.

Our new Treasurer, Ron Charles. Presented us with a current financial report and a five year forecast. We remain in stable financial condition, due in part to the fact that we have not held the ADM in Montreal for several years. We have several projects proposed, with benefits to the organization, that will require some funding, which he can build into that forecast and ensure continued stability. The motion was passed to have the National Council continue to retain \$2 per year of the dues from contributing members, with the balance being distributed back to the Regional/Provincial/Local Councils.

Suzanne Dalzell, head of Strategic Partnerships for CN presented on their role and the interface with our Association. They manage the Railroaders in the Community (RRITC) program and there will be a separate article on this program and the changes for 2024 in this newsletter. In 2024, they plan to organize multiple community events across Canada in conjunction with the June 6th birthday celebration of CN. They also plan to revive the Econnexions Program, with tree planting events across the country. As these plans evolve, there will be opportunities for our members to participate in these events and we will keep you advised as they happen.

We continue to fine tune the Association's Constitution and National By-Laws with several amendments proposed and passed at the ADM. Once they have been translated and new versions finalized, they will be available through both our website, www.cnpensioners.ca and the national website, www.cnpensioners.org.

There was a report from our new Federal Government Liaison Officer, Mike Matthews. In conjunction with his committee of Provincial Government Liaison Officers (Albert Delbaere represents MB) they continually monitor the activities of the Federal and Provincial Governments and highlight to us any government bills that are of interest to our membership.

We have a new Communications Officer in Tim Urbanovitch as Ken Roberts has stepped down after several years. Ken did a great job on the newsletter, along with our Joanne Gaborieau, the Associate Editor, and Tim is already up and running with the next newsletter being delivered in January and the cutoff for the next one at the end of January as well.

Our National webmaster, George Rowan, has further developed the website and it now has features like direct links to several sites to reduce the time required for posting updates. There are links between our MB site and the National site where it makes sense to share common information. The site has a very easy look and feel to it, easy to navigate, and there is a lot of information at your fingertips to let you know what benefits you have, how to interface for those benefits when you have questions, information on programs available to our members, information or links to local councils, and we now have a searchable database for obituaries that currently has 36 months of records.

More Money for Your Charities

- Starting in 2024, the maximum number of eligible hours for volunteering pensioners will increase from 150 to 220. The charity will still receive \$15 for every volunteer hour up to that limit, so your charities can now be eligible to receive \$3,300 per year for your efforts, an increase from the previous \$2,250.
- We have maintained a very high number of volunteers this year and we hope to have the 2023 year end numbers in the newsletters in early 2024.

All Aboard the Prairie Dog Central Let's Take a Ride on the Rails

We are proposing a day trip on the Prairie Dog Central for any **contributing members** that wish to join us on a weekday in July, 2024. You will be transported in a vintage coach for about an hour each way, between Prairie Dog Junction (off Centreport Canada Way), and the turnaround at Grosse Isle. There is about an hour included at Grosse Isle for you to have a light sandwich lunch. You can also use some of that time to tour the area which now includes the old Emerson station as they are in the process of planning renovations to it.

We will have the option of booking one or more complete coaches, but we will need to know by April how many are interested. Once their offices open in April, we can use that indication of demand to reserve one or more coaches. That way we can keep the coach(es) that we book exclusive, for just our members. We don't have to actually purchase the tickets until 3 weeks prior to the actual train date, so we would need your payment prior to that date. We will be able to finalize the actual date of the trip once we talk to them in April, when they open up their offices for the season.

Tickets will be subsidized to reduce the price to \$20 per ticket to contributing members (limit 2 per member), which includes the round trip and the lunch.

If you are interested in model railroading, and are willing to wait for the general crowd to disperse after we arrive back at Prairie Dog Jct, Gerrit Vanderklok has offered to open up the "N scale" model railroad exhibition which is set up in a building immediately behind the Prairie Dog buildings adjacent to their parking lot. It is an exhibit well worth the time to see, incredible detail and some modelling reflecting Winnipeg structures.

We will have signup sheets at the General Meetings at the CN Campus at the February, March and April meetings, and we will use that as an indicator of how much space we should be reserving from them for the July trip.

IMPORTANCE OF CHANGING YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION

Whenever you move or have new contact information, it is important for you to change your address, telephone number and email address (if any) with CN Pension and Benefits Administration. This way you will get your CN Calendar, your Tax slips, the CNPA National Newsletter, the CN Pension Committee Annual Report, Blue Cross information and other updates.

It is also important to advise CN Pensions & Benefits of any status changes (e.g. family to single) as your MEDAVIE Blue Cross premium rates could be affected.

To change your address info, you should call the <u>CN PENSION and BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION</u> at 1-800-361-0739, have your PIN ready OR make the change on the website at: <u>cnbenefits.hroffice.com</u>.

The CN Pension and Benefits group can also help you to log-on to the web site if you have questions.

To avoid time delays from receiving your CNPA **Manitoba** newsletter, you should also advise a member of our local council. Our names are shown on Page 2 of the newsletter.

On Friday, July 14th, 2023, the City of Winnipeg and the Transcona Museum Board and staff were pleased to announce that CN will be the major sponsor for the CN 2747 Steam Locomotive protective enclosure with a contribution of \$200,000 over four years.

The CN 2747 steam locomotive is an artifact of significant historical importance not only to the community of Transcona but to Canada. It was the

first steam locomotive constructed by CN at the Transcona Shops and the first locomotive built in Western Canada in 1926. After 34 years of service, CN 2747 was retired and placed on permanent outdoor display in 1960. CN 2747 and the structure are located in Rotary Heritage Park at 735 Kildare Avenue West.


