The November meeting will be held, as usual, at the Norwood Legion.



# What is a Patient Advocate?

You have the right to get help from a trusted friend or family member when you receive healthcare services. This person is called a **patient advocate**. A patient advocate can act on your behalf according to your instructions. She or he can share your healthcare needs and wishes. An advocate can be a second set of eyes and ears during the healthcare process.

# Your patient advocate can:

- Arrange medical appointments
- Attend medical appointments, tests and treatments with you
- Be present when a doctor or provider speaks with you
- Review your healthcare provider's handwritten information to help you read and understand it
- Ask questions about your healthcare and test results
- Access your personal health information if you agree
- Track your medications
- Communicate your needs and requests

### **Remember:**

- Choose your patient advocate before you need one
- Be clear on the type of help you want
- Fill out the MIPS "My Patient Advocate Agreement". Go to www.safetoask.ca/s.a.f.e.-toolkit/patient advocate agreement

### For further tips on finding an advocate:

- Leave copies of this form with your doctor and your patient advocate
- Give your family and healthcare providers the name of your patient advocate

# Before you decide to be someone's patient advocate, ask yourself:

- Will I have the time and energy to support the patient?
- Will I be able to speak up if problems occur?
- Will I act in the best interests of the patient?
- Will I support the patient's healthcare wishes?
- Is a second advocate needed?

# To avoid confusion, record your healthcare wishes on:

- "My Patient Advocate Agreement"
- A Health Care Directive (Living Will): Call 204-945-6565 in Winnipeg or toll-free 1-800-665-6565 for a copy of a Health Care Directive or go to http://www.gov.mb.ca/health/livingwill.html.

# **Good Samaritans Among Us**


The CN Pensioners' Association is very proud of our Manitoba Association Special Events Chair Ernie Yakiwchuk and his wife Gwen, also a CN employee.

By then, several neighbours had gathered and watched in horror along with the families who lost everything in the fire. Fortunately, all of the residents made it out safely and at least had that to be thankful for.

While watching this terrible event, Ernie and Gwen noticed a young couple with a baby standing outside the burning building. They immediately went over and spoke to them and learned that they were a family of 8 with children ranging in age from one month to 17 years old. They had lived on the third
