Blue Cross Report

Carson Hull 269 2692

Attention all Veterans who are currently covered by DVA, and are paying family rates with our Blue Cross, to cover your spouse. Please be advised you can now apply to blue Cross to change your coverage for your spouse to "single rates' rather than family. The only exception is if you have dependants living with you then it is necessary to retain family coverage.

Coverage under the 5 Day Trip;—the limitation on the distance travelled has been eliminated and the restriction by "air" is now gone. These trips are covered by Blue Cross with CNPA and there is no problem should you or your spouse be required to change your prescriptions just before your trip.. If you become hospitalised in the U.S.A. and your stay is over 5 days, your coverage continues. You're required to pay all bills, keeping receipts for presentation to Blue Cross on your return. Hospital stay must be on an emergency basis.

Keep in mind, this is for the maximum 5 day trips only. Extra insurance is required for longer trips and most Insurance companies require a varying amount of time with no changes in your prescriptions before they will insure your travel.

Re Indexation

January we received a 1.02% increase in your basic CN monthly pension for qualifying retirees.

It doesn't sound like much what with Blue Cross premiums going up each year, primarily by the increase in prescription drugs that we all seem to have to take to stay healthy but there a lot of company pensions that do not have this provision.

Curiously, I wanted to know how much my CN pension had increased over the years. From 1993 to 2010 my CN monthly pension has increased \$558.35 a moth.

This year my monthly pension increased \$29.73 so every little bit helps.

A little history of the Manitoba Pensioners Association as I recall.

In 1987 a group of UTU seniors as we called ourselves, retired trainmen and conductors, formed a group to meet once a month to stay in touch with our past on the CN. Shop-Craft and Depot retirees belonged to the CNR Veterans Association Division #1, (the Vets), which originated in 1930.

The Vets had their own club room in the lower level of the Union Depot. They had their own piano, shuffle board, card playing bridge group with large lounging chairs probably scrounged from passenger sleeping cars. They met twice a month, a social meeting with coffee and sandwiches the other was their business meeting.

I joined the Vets in 1988 and found that they had had a falling out with the National Council and did not send representatives to the N.C. annual general meeting. The Company recognized the N.C. as the only group that represented all CN retirees. I had gone to the N.C. AGM in 1988 as a representative of the UTU Seniors at the insistence of President Don Mills of the N.C. We only had 67 members at the time but N.C. paid all my expenses which were considerable as return air fare at that time was over \$1,000.

As a member of both retired groups in Winnipeg I was able to convince the Vets to re-affiliate with the N.C. The Vets, at the time had several hundred members and were welcome back into the fold of the N.C.

At our last December's Christmas luncheon we were blessed with five of our Honourary Members two who were originally officers of the Vets, Stan Siwik secretary, George and Gerrie Turnley, along with Barbara McGregor, and Lawrence and Flo. Webb. Regrets from John Almdal, George Clements & Jim Harris.
