

Special Points of Interest:

Fisher Branch CNR Station is a fine representative of one of the modest, straightforward station designs used in the early 1900s by the Canadian Northern Railway, a predecessor of the CNR, as it expanded throughout southern Manitoba. Half devoted to railway traffic, and half to housing the station agent's family, the building recalls the vital roles train stations held for rural Manitoba towns, representing development, growth and links to the larger world. Taken out of service in 1980, the station today remains a vital component in the community as the Rolling Memories Museum.

CNPA Annual Director's Meeting Update

National Treasurer's report: Of the \$12 we pay annually in membership fees, \$10.00 of that will come back to the individual councils and \$2.00 goes to the National Council. Bottom line, the more members we have means the more money that will be rebated back to us. This also applies to the CN Partnership where CN is giving us \$1 per payroll deduction (PRD) member to help support our endeavours in servicing our membership as well as in participating in CN events such as their Tree Planting program. So if you are in receipt of a CN Pension or spousal pension and are still paying by cheque, this is another reason to sign up to have your \$1 per month automatically deducted from your pension.

For those on Blue Cross, you should have received information from Blue Cross in December advising that the five day travel rule is being cancelled effective Dec 31, 2017. The 5 day rule was very ineffective and misleading. Make sure you have adequate travel insurance to cover yourselves if you are travelling to the USA or some other foreign destination.

New Pension Web Portal will soon be launched which will allow all pensioners to access your personal information, update your address and banking information and get important pension-related information forms at a single location. We expect that details of the new pension web portal will be mailed to your home soon. Instructions on how to register and log in to the pension web portal will be provided. If you don't have a computer, do not worry. CN Pension and Benefits Administration remains available to assist you by phone. You can always call their toll free number at 1-800-361-0739. We will also make this information available to you in our next newsletter as well as on our website and facebook page.

There is a process in place to establish a Canadian Railway Museum and has been for a few years and the Pensioners Association is going to support "EXPO Rail" in Saint Constant/Delson, Quebec.

The Partnership agreement we had for 2017 with CN will continue for 2018. CN would therefore appreciate participation from pensioners at some of these events such as the Tree Planting program mentioned above especially when they are in or close to your community. We are also approaching the 100th Anniversary of CN (2019) where there will be more events across the system celebrating our centennial. We will share these details with you as they become available.

The National Council is establishing a "Code of Conduct" for our National Council Constitution and Bylaws. Most or all organizations have a Code of Conduct which provides guidance in preserving the respect and rights of all members.

The National Council will continue to sponsor a Scholarship program with 5 - \$1,500 scholarships for each of the 5 regions for a total of 25 scholarships. The Manitoba Association will also continue to offer the Harvey Hosfield Bursary and Trade Bursary. For more information, visit our website or the National Council website.

Johnson Insurance will still be offering discounted rates to members of our Association. We still recommend that you shop around to find the right policy/provider that best suits your needs. They now have "Flood Coverage". This was not prevalent in Canada before, but since we have had some issues with it, they now cover it. Of course it costs money and is not covered in known "Flood Zones". Johnson Insurance will also continue their Scholarship Program offering 50 people \$1,000 dollar Scholarships.

We will continue to receive the list of centenarians from CN. Where possible, we will be personally delivering the special plaque to CN Pensioners/surviving spouses who will be turning 100 this year. This is actually sponsored by CN and the CN Pension Committee.

The National Council is establishing a National Facebook page in both English and French. This will be officially announced in the Spring edition of the National newsletter. A National Facebook page will be another useful communication tool in keeping you up to date on relevant and important information and events.

The National website www.cnpensioners.org has now been updated with the newly elected National Executive, Directors, Alternate Directors and Health and Pension Committees. Gary Heasman of Saskatoon Council was elected Vice-President for the Prairie Region.

You should have already received your Calendar for 2018. These only go to the members that are on Payroll Deduction (PRD). Since this is a new offering, there are a few kinks to work out so that associate members also receive a Calendar in a timely manner. So if you are in receipt of a CN Pension but paying by cheque, we encourage you to sign up to have your \$1 per month automatically deducted. This will save your volunteers the need to manually manage this benefit as well as reduce the cost of mailing. CN currently covers the cost of mailing these calendars to those members who on are PRD. If you are not on PRD, and want to receive a calendar for 2019, please talk to Joanne Gaborieau, or anyone on the Executive and sign up to have your \$1 per month membership fee automatically deducted. As info, it would cost us over \$3 to mail each calendar. If you are an Associate member, we will still have to handle the process manually.

Finally, in a effort to keep our local costs down, please consider signing up to receive our Manitoba newsletter via email. It is very easy to do so. Just visit our website at www.cnpensioners.ca and then our Newsletter page. Complete the sign up form and follow the instructions and then you will be automatically added to our "Newsletter by Email" data base.
