About your CN Pension Plan

I received a phone call the other day from a pensioner who has been retired 10 years and his question was, "when is our contract up with CN?" He will not see this answer as he doesn't belong to CNPA of Manitoba., so he won't be receiving this newsletter.

His 'contract' with CN ended the date he took his CN Pension. On further questioning his concern was the news that the inflation rate had gone up 3% and could continue to increase with the price of oil. He was also concerned how the Plan could afford to continue in these uncertain times?

I tried to explain the terms of the defined benefit pension plan that he belongs to, that he is guaranteed his pension. There are many checks and balances governing the CN Pension Plan, the CN Pension Trust Fund, the vehicle that provides the money to pay.....his pension.......For instance.....

On page 71 of the CN 2010 Annual Report states under, "Additional disclosures"....'Fair value of plan assets at end of year'—\$15, 097 billion, compared to \$14,332 billion at the end of 2009.

The CN Pension Trust Fund is called a Notional Fund, which means that there are is more than one fund under this "umbrella'. The Escalation Account is the Fund that funds the indexing formula for qualifying CN pensioners. When investments returns exceed the 5% threshold on investments re the E.A., maximum indexing formula is applied and when the 10% threshold is achieved, pension improvements can be recommended to CN Board of Directors by the CN Pension Committee for approvable.

The Pension Benefits Standard Act, 1985, the Income Tax Act, the Trustee Melon Trust, the Auditors and other obligations must be adhered to by the Company as they have a fiduciary responsibility to all members of the Plan

The Company has recently set up the defined contribution benefit plan, the 401 K's for U.S employees and are phasing out the 1935 CN Pension Plan due to attrition of the members of 1935 Plan.

Remember, that we belong to the 'defined benefit pension plan', the above plans are for non-schedule new employees and the Company's U.S. employees.

The indexing formula is based of a 12 month checking formula of a particular group of products that Statistics Canada uses for the period between July 1st and June 30th of the previous year.

Actuarial value as of December 31/2009.....Market value \$13,607 B. and the liability of pensioners was \$8,010. B. (this figure is used when the 5% & 10% values are calculated.)

The Escalation Account balance was \$781. M. and the Improvement Account, which applies to the unions was minus (\$41. M.) and the Improvement Account re non union members was a plus \$34. Million. The surplus was \$888. Million.

The above figures were provided by your president of the CNMPA.

Often asked , where are the Plans assets invested in.? From page 68 of the 2010 annual report....."The Policy mix in 2010 was: 2% cash and short-term investment, 38% bonds, 47% equities, 4% real estate, 5% oil and gas and 4% infrastructure assets.
