History of the CNPA of Manitoba

The General Superintendent, W R Devenish, acting upon advice and authority given to him by the President, Sir Henry Thornton, in order to promote, maintain, and foster social and fraternal feelings, keep alive the traditions of the Canadian National Railways, to preserve the loyalty and brotherhood of its employees, and with the approval of the management formed ourselves into an Association. This Association shall be known as the Canadian National Railways Veterans' Association, Division no. 1, Prairie Region, Canadian National Railways. The date was Saturday, October 17, 1930. There were 35 retired employees listed as members. This Association continued to operate until December 1995.

In December of 1995 a group of CN retirees gathered to elect the Executive Committee for the newly named Manitoba Division # 1 of CN Pensioners' Association. This Association (which was an amalgamation of Manitoba Council of CN Pensioners Association and the CN Veterans' Association, Manitoba Division # 1) ultimately became the CN Pensioners' Association of Manitoba. This new Association met for the first time in January 1996 with John Almdal as President, Jim Harris as Vice President. Past Presidents were Borge Gade and Gil Blais. The Treasurer was Lloyd Marshall. The Outreach Committee consisted of Willis Archibald, Jim Buchanan, Hank Gosselin, Vern McGregor and George Turnley. The Publicity Committee had two members, Harvey Hosfield and Wally Senyshen. The Entertainment Committee consisted of Borge Gade, Harry Diakiw, Gert Williams and Pat Wilson. The Membership Committee was composed of Bill Cameron, Lloyd Marshall, Laurie Webb and Vern Peterson. The Secretary was Ron Davis. The Constitution Committee was George Chase, Ron Davis, George Clements and Harvey Hosfield. The National Director was George Chase.

At the time of amalgamation there were over 500 paid up members. Twenty years later nearly 4000 are paid up members and Ron Davis is still active in the Association as President.

To celebrate our 20th anniversary we invited the President of the National Council of CN Pensioners' Associations Yves Bourdon, the National Treasurer Bruce Peacock, Darlene Cherry of Morneau Shepell (the administrator of CN Pensions and Benefits) and Jim Feeny, Director of Public Affairs to join us in Winnipeg. All of our invited guests made presentations to the members at our monthly meeting on Wednesday, May 4th.

A huge birthday cake was enjoyed by all.



Meet Your Fellow Pensioner - Bill Brychka and his wife June Brychka

Bill Brychka: Bill began his career with CN with the B&B Department in May 1948 working out of Hudson Bay where every day he would go down to the station to learn about switching. One of the Switchman in Hudson Bay was kind enough to teach Bill all the signals that Bill would need to know in order to move into the Running trades.

In September 1948, as a new Brakeman, Bill was supposed to make "three student trips" (no pay). However, because he had already spent a lot of time learning the signals and operating rules from the Hudson Bay Switchman, Bill only had to make two "student" trips" and was put on the payroll.

His first trip was as a Head End Brakeman on a "way-freight" from Dauphin to Kamsack. He received his first pay cheque as a Head End Trainman on September 11th, 1948. As he moved up on the seniority list, Bill was able to move to Tail End Trainman and then as a Conductor in 1952.



Bill worked many 'work trains' and seemed to be away most of their marriage. The year their 3rd child was due to be born, the "work train" he was on was so far up north there was no telephone service. When son Jimmy decided to arrive early (September instead of October), Bill didn't get to meet his new son Jimmy until he was already 2 weeks old!! However, thanks to CN, June was able to speak with Bill from a 2-way radio to let him know that their son had been born. Apparently June kept forgetting to say "over" & most of the conversation got 'lost' because of that!

In 1987 Bill decided it was time to pull the pin and retire from CN. His last run was working on Passenger between The Pas and Thompson. He was met by all his family and relatives when the train arrived in The Pas – it was a very special moment in his life!

Retirement life has kept Bill busy. He was one of the first players to join the Dauphin Noon Hour Hockey League (NHHL). He managed to play hockey until he was 80 years old and was the oldest on the team. He also played on the Dauphin Senior 55+ Slo Pitch baseball for 16 years. On September 30, 1998 while golfing with his Noon Hour Hockey team wind-up at Dauphin Country Club, Bill made a "hole in one" - a dream of every golfer!

Bill loved golfing and had a membership at the Gilbert Plains Country Club. He managed to play golf every fine summer day. He still manages to get the odd game in when family come home for Ukrainian Festival every summer.

Bill's hobby now is making his home-made wine. Almost all repairmen that come to their home to do work as well as their cleaning lady, end up leaving with a plastic shopping bag filled with a bottle from his wine cellar!

June Brychka: June started her working career as switchboard operator at the Dauphin General Hospital in the early 1950's. She worked the evening shift (5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.) until their first baby arrived in 1957. June became a "stay at home Mom" until all of their three children were school age. With all three children in school, June became very lonely with no children at home during the day and Bill being on the road. She sought her doctor's advice and after listening to whatever, he said "June, you have the worst "empty-nest syndrome" I have ever seen!! Go get a job!! And so she did!

In 1969 June started at Manitoba Telephone System as a part-time telephone operator. Since working, only part time, she wasn't building up any seniority so started full time shortly afterwards. She worked for MTS until 1989 when she retired due to MTS being "sold" by the present government at that time as plans for privatization began. Although they had been told that none of the 250 operators in Dauphin would lose their jobs as a result of the change in Provincial Government at that time, they did not realize that their jobs would no longer be in Dauphin. Some of the operators tried traveling back and forth to Brandon to work as some were so close to meeting their "magic number" for retirement. Unfortunately, they only got to work "Directory Assistance" which was a very tiring position and with having to rent an apartment in Brandon, plus the driving back and forth (most operators had families in Dauphin), it just wasn't paying off. Apparently only one operator stuck it out in Brandon until retirement. As time passed, and her three children – Jan, Mary and Jim became adults and began their own family, June was soon to embark on becoming a full time Grandma – a job she treasured! As her family gradually moved away to other parts of the country, June expanded her retirement activities.

Knitting Ministry - A Labour of Love

Through the Dauphin First United Church Knitting Ministry, June helps bring peace and comfort to those in need. June actually helped form this ministry in 2004 and co-ordinates it with Jean Saboraki. The 56 x 27 inch shawls are made on a cro-hook, a large double-ended crochet hook. When informed of someone in need, such as a person struggling with cancer, or a special request for a person in the hospital or nursing home, they arrange to have a prayer shawl sent to that person. Included with the shawl is a letter with several prayers, the history of the prayer shawl and washing instructions. Since 2004, the group has distributed 221 shawls locally and around the world. The program is managed through donations from Dauphin First United Church, from shawl recipients, or from members of the public. June has found this project to be extremely satisfying. The comments received back from the recipients truly warm the heart.
